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New Cardiovascular Health Dashboard - now live


The Cardiovascular Health Dashboard is now live on Thalamus.

This new dashboard is designed to provide you with a comprehensive and actionable view of information on patients' cardiovascular health and risk factors.

Features assist you in providing care to your patients given population and individual level data.

New features include:

- Population Risk Bands: This feature allows you to see immediately the risk status of your patient population, from the patients' last CVDRA.
- Clinical and Funded Guidelines: The dashboard provides you with the latest clinical and funded guidelines to help you make informed decisions about CVDRAs.
- Eligibility for Management Program: You can now quickly determine if a patient is eligible for our CVD management program based on their risk status, demographics etc.
- Overdue and High-Risk Bookmarks: This feature enables you to easily keep track of patients who are overdue for a CVDRA and patients that are at high risk of a CVD event based on their medical history.
- No Scripts for ACE/ARB, Statins, etc.: The dashboard highlights patients that have been prescribed various scripts in the last 6 months making it easier for you to ensure your patients are on the right medication.
- Blood Pressure Targets: We now pull in the appropriate Health Pathways target for the patient based on demographics/ages/risk band/presence of diabetes.
- Comprehensive Patient Export: The dashboard provides you with a detailed patient export that you can use for recall and prioritisation purposes.



To get started, simply log into Thalamus and start exploring. The new report is highlighted on the homepage.

As always, *go live* is not the end; we have a few more features we will be releasing with updates posted on the Thalamus homepage, but we wanted to get this tool in your hands now as we believe it is a huge improvement over the current Cardiovascular disease and risk data on Proactive Care.

Measles vaccination for Pasifika patients

Measles vaccination rates among Pasifika 15–29-year-olds in Otago/Southand are currently at 57%. Given the frequency of travel between here and the Pacific Islands, the low rates of vaccination on those islands, and the recently reported first case of measles in Aotearoa since 2019, it is vital we lift those immunisation rates as quickly as possible.

You can download a list of the names of your Pasifika patients who are not fully immunised on Thalamus via Measles Vaccinations>Cohorts Not Done, then select 'Pacific'. COVID-19 Response Recognition Award

On December 31 2022, Jacinda Adern announced that groups of frontline workers were to receive a COVID-19 Response Recognition Award, a specific acknowledgement of the service given by so many to New Zealand during the pandemic. This includes MIQ, border, testing, contact tracing and vaccination workforces. Read the full announcement <a href="https://example.com/here/beauty-service-new-marker-beauty-servic

To be eligible for the COVID-19 Response Individual Award you need to have been employed or contracted by Ministry of Health (MOH) or identified as part of the COVID-19 Health and Disability System Response (HSR) for a minimum of 1 month between March 2020 and 30 June 2022 and been active in a role:

- That provided direct operational support to the frontline COVID-19 Health and Disability response; or
- As a Doctor, Nurse or Healthcare and Disability staff who cared for patients with COVID-19, including for example, disability support workers and Māori hauora providers, Pacific health workers

'Direct Operational Support' refers to those workers who may not necessarily have faced COVID-19 every day or administered vaccinations but whose roles were critical to ensuring that others could. If you are still unsure whether you are eligible, please contact the team at c19RecognitionAwards@health.govt.nz and we can help.

Contractors, part-time and full-time staff who meet above criteria are eligible to apply for the award.

Please register through the Te Whatu Ora registration portal https://covid-19responseaward.powerappsportals.com/ by 3 March 2023. Registrations will be reviewed against the criteria and awarded after approval.

Awards are a lapel pin in a display box and a personalised certificate. These will be sent to New Zealand addresses.
