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# Cilazapril to be discontinued

Cilazapril is set to be discontinued in **mid-2023**, three to four months from now. In the Southern region over 9000 patients have received a prescription for Cilazapril since 1 August 2022, and many of these patients may only receive one more Cilazapril prescription before it becomes unavailable. As such, it is essential that we proactively switch these patients to an alternative ACE or ARB in the coming months.

The Thalamus report identifies patients who have been prescribed Cilazapril since last August, and whether or not they have received a subsequent prescription of an alternative ACE or ARB.

It is worth noting that this report will not show Cilazapril patients who have switched to an alternative antihypertensive that is not an ACE/ARB or ceased taking Cilazapril altogether. Additionally, the report will also include the patient's most recent blood pressure results, if that result was recorded within the past three months, and if that result is at or above an appropriate target level based on HealthPathways guidance.

# **Medical Protection Society - New Practice Package**

If you heard Dr Sam King speak at one of the recent forums, you will know that from **1 April** Medical Protection Society will be offering cover for general practices as an entity, a change from their current model.

Depending on the size of your practice you will be placed in one of three pricing tiers:

- Tier 1 for 2 FTE GPs is \$3,000 + GST;
- Tier 2 for 6 FTE GPs is \$3,750 + GST;
- Tier 3 for more than 6 FTE GPs is a bespoke price.
